Dear Assistant Secretary Briggs:

I am writing to request clarification on a school's eligibility for funds under section 1003 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). Under section 1003(a), a state must reserve four percent of its Title I, Part A allocation to carryout certain state-level responsibilities related to school improvement. States must distribute at least ninety-five percent of the four percent to local education agencies (LEAs) for schools identified for improvement, corrective action or restructuring.

It is not clear, however, whether the school must be receiving Title I, Part A funds in order to be eligible to receive section 1003 funds. Can a school that is not receiving Title I, Part A funds receive section 1003 funds under the following scenarios? The Department has advised that states may, but are not required to, apply sanctions under section 1116 of the ESEA to non-Title I schools that fail to make adequate yearly progress. If a state chooses to apply such sanctions to a non-Title I school would the school be eligible to receive section 1003 funds? What if a school identified for improvement, corrective action or restructuring previously received section 1003 funds but looses its eligibility for Title I, Part A under section 1113 of the ESEA? Would such a school continue to be eligible to receive section 1003 funds? Would the answer depend on whether the state continued to treat such a school as a school identified for improvement, corrective action or restructuring?

Thank you in advance for your response to these questions.
